Introduction

It has been another successful year at the Foundation. We continued to provide grants where they are most needed in our communities, supporting the work of charities and small voluntary led organisations.

We awarded three capital build projects through our Building Better Lives Fund. Supporting organisations in the Black Country, Birmingham and Coventry. The grants are the largest ever awarded by the Foundation and were awarded in November 2019. Unlike our usual awards, where results can be almost instant, these projects will take up to 18 months to reach their potential.

We continued our partnership with Wesleyan Assurance in which we delivered significant investments at grassroots level across the UK. During this period, we celebrated awarding £862,967 through the Wesleyan Foundation.

We continued to deliver grant programmes for the City of Culture Trust, supporting community organisations and individual artists in preparation for Coventry's City of Culture Year in 2021. We were able to secure funding from the Esmee Fairbairn Foundation to enhance the grant making to ensure the City of Culture programme was diverse and representative of the communities living in Coventry.

We continued to forge new relationships across the region. We were very proud of winning our very first contract with Birmingham City Council to deliver the Neighbourhood Network Scheme Grant Making for Edgbaston & Northfield.

Towards the end of the year, we had to quickly divert our energies in response to the emerging COVID-19 pandemic. We launched a local appeal with our CEO, Tina Costello, appearing on BBC Midlands Today and local radio. We launched a new fund in response to COVID-19 the Coronavirus Resilience Fund. The aim of the fund was to support our communities during the pandemic. As we were only just embarking on this journey, we will talk more about this in our next report.

Success Rates:

Success rates vary from year to year this is due to the size of budgets we have available and demand exceeding availability.

Our most oversubscribed programme this year once again was **Tampon Tax Community Fund**. Our allocation from the Department of Culture Media and Sport was for £167,530. We received 83 applications and were able to fund 19 of these. The average grant size was £8,817.

New Programmes:

A summary of our new grant programmes launched during the year:

gb Partnerships

The gb partnerships Community Fund focuses on health, education, empowerment and raising people's skills and aspirations. There are grants of up to £2,000 for organisations based within a 10-mile radius of gb partnerships' <u>Coventry and Birmingham sites.</u>

Esmee Fairbairn Foundation – City of Culture Grants

This allocation allowed us to support the expansion and strengthening of the arts and cultural sector in Coventry and increase cultural engagement in Coventry among under-represented groups. Grants of up to £10,000 were available.

Uber

During this year we launched this pilot fund. Grants of up to £5,000 were available in Birmingham. The fund aimed to support local communities and projects across two key areas, Economic Opportunity and Community Safety

The priority of the fund was to support small, locally based organisations being run by people directly affected by the issues they are dealing with and that have a clear understanding of the needs they are supporting. This could also include "Communities of Interest" which covered a wider geographical area. They aim to meet one or more of the following:


- Increase local projects or activity.

Longleigh

The Longleigh Foundation Community Fund aims to support registered charities, community and voluntary organisations which have a focus on understanding, preventing and addressing discriminatory and hate-related behaviour and crime in communities across the Black Country. Grants of up to £5,000 were available.
