Supporting older people to keep active

Xpress-Yourself Dance CIC are an organisation who make dance accessible for older adults. Their work has a great focus on preventing social isolation as well as promoting healthy ageing, mental health and independence for older people. In September 2022 we awarded them a grant of £4,520 through the Solihull Celebrating Communities Fund for their 'Keep Dancing at Christmas' project. The project provides dance classes over the period leading up to Christmas for older individuals in the community. Local businesses have been supported and benefitted through the project, the dance project culminated in an event where local caterers were hired and also Sing Bentley Heath were booked to perform whilst everyone sat to enjoy their food.

Company Director at Xpress-Yourself Dance CIC, Faye O'Connor, shared: "Throughout this project the participants have formed friendships with people of similar age and share similar life experiences, forming a sense of belonging with their community. They've built their confidence and self-esteem through performing and know how much more they can personally challenge themselves going forward.

"The participants quite quickly became quite a tight unit which was noticeable in their body language as they were all tactile continuing to hold hands whilst we paused rehearsals to repeat steps for instance. Giving each other hugs to encourage and support one another, it was like dance had acted as a tool to eliminate uncomfortable physical touch."

Faye continued: "Recently one of the participants who performed lost her husband who she had been the primary carer for. She put herself forward to the project for the opportunity to meet new people, a reason to get up and out of the house and to have a positive focus. Other participants in the group were also widows and were able to offer her support and guidance through their friendship and shared experience.

"The dancing provided with her with a focus at home as she practiced the steps after each rehearsal. She also put herself forward to help us set up the room before the event and has been a great support to us an organisation. The other participants really looked after her and formed a community around her to make sure she knew she had support and purpose."



Supporting children with disabilities

Friends of Castlewood School were awarded a £5,000 grant from the Youell Family Fund to help continue their work for children with additional needs, including running a vibrant Saturday club. It's Saturday morning and there's a stampede of children as the doors at Castlewood School fling open. Sue Rumble, Group Fundraiser, said: "We've been running for 10 years. We normally have about 50 kids and we have 30 on the waiting list as a lot of the children can't use mainstream activities.

"We split them into six different groups depending on their needs. Some children are non-verbal, some are autistic, some use wheelchairs, two girls have brittle bones which can be quite tricky." The organisation provides much needed care for children and also provides space to allow siblings to join: "We offer options for children with needs to bring their sibling as well. Sometimes at home, they don't get pushed out as such, but their sibling gets priority. They don't moan about it, but here they can share their experiences with others." And of course, thanks to the excellent care, parents are provided with some much needed respite.

Asia's son, Rhasid, uses the service: "Having a child with special needs can destroy more able families, for me it meant having no more kids and sitting at home making sure Rhasid is ok. It can be quite a big, deep, dark world. Even family members don't understand. Since coming to this provision it's helped me get back into working. "I don't want to sound selfish, but it gives parents a chance to get on with things we need to do. Saturday Club is a blessing, I'm so happy."

Unfortunately, when children reach 11 the service is no longer available to them. Something Ravinder, another parent, is coming to terms with: "The service isn't just on a Saturday, they're always there to support us and answer any questions. I'm worried about my son being too old for the service, I'm trying not to think about it to be honest."

Finally, we caught up with Ella. Her son has autism but her daughter, as a sibling, takes advantage of the club: "The provisions are really good here, for £20 there are loads of things available. My youngest is profoundly autistic, I knew from the moment I came here that I was in the right place. They know how to talk to me and my child. My elder child is very withdrawn and needs to be part of a group too, she makes friends here. This makes me feel fantastic. Finding a playgroup is impossible for Julian and it's so important that my daughter Olympia has somewhere to go as well!"



Supporting communities to access nature and green spaces

Caldmore Community Garden. Nestled in the heart of urban Walsall, Caldmore Community Garden stands as a thriving oasis of greenery amidst high and low-rise flats, offering respite and enrichment to a community often deprived of access to nature.

Through the funding, the Community Garden has supported local residents to access the new green space, especially for those who live in the surrounding flats and houses who lack gardens of their own. Through a series of engaging educational programmes tailored to families and individuals, the group has supported local people with a passion for gardening to nurture deeper connections with the natural world. As well as supporting local residents to access green spaces the garden is also being developed a place for enhancing local biodiversity with birds, insects and small animals living in the garden.

One local resident commented: "My best moment was the first day I went in. I'm known as a person who fears new experiences so I was really nervous that day and it was my first time volunteering. But the moment I went in, I was glad to see some other people I knew, but most importantly all the people and stuff there was so welcoming.

"I wouldn't say it (of) many places, but the garden felt like home, even on my first day. I'm free to my opinion, my voice is heard, my effort is appreciated. I feel (I) belong there. I love the respect they give for my religion, letting me pray and giving me the space. They are considerate about the food being halal for Muslim like us. I really want to thank them. Some weekends I just go to the garden like my therapy session to get away from schoolwork or even home. The memorable moment was painting the boards, i felt honoured to participate in such a beautiful artwork."

Another participant who took part in the project in the last tweleve months said:

"This place is an absolute lifesaver for us. I don't know how we'd have continued with our home education without it. Invaluable events, activities, meeting others, a beautiful space!"
